


Cyber Safety is Important.

Here are some tips for you to stay safe:

- Never talk to strangers. Don't communicate with strangers online and never agree to meet in person. Tell your parents or guardian if a stranger is trying to pressure you into meeting in person.
- Never share any personal information like your home address, cell phone number, or your birthday without getting your parents' or guardians' approval first.
- Always remember that all that glitters is not gold. Never click on emails where someone is saying that something is free, for example, an email stating that you have won money, games, devices, or any contest. It's a trick and someone is trying to get access to your computer to steal your personal information.

Adware Program screen that is displayed as an advertisement,

often installed without the user's permission.

Cat-fishing Luring someone into a relationship, either through a

chatroom or social media website using a fake identity.

Clickbait Something (such as a headline) designed to make

readers want to click on a hyperlink especially when the link leads to content of questionable value or interest.

Cookies You can't eat these, BUT they keep track of your user

preferences.

Cyberbully A person who uses online platforms to hurt someone else

with words or pictures.

Cybersecurity Measures taken to protect a computer or computer

system (as on the Internet) against unauthorized access or attack.

Data Information that is stored on a device or computer.

Download The act of transferring a file(s) from a website or another

computer to yours.

Firewall Computer hardware or software that prevents unwanted

access to private data on a home or office computer by

outside users on the internet.

Hacker A person who illegally gains access to a computer system/

smartphone to tamper with any/all online data.

Hardware The physical components of a computer system, such as the

monitor, hard drive, keyboard, mouse, etc.

Identity Theft A crime that involves someone obtaining personal information

such as a credit card, social security number, or bank account

number from someone else usually to steal money.

Internet A giant collection of computer networks that connects

people to information from all over the world.

Malware Short for "malicious software". These are programs that damage

computer, steal personal information, or expose a computer

to further damage by hackers.

Network Multiple computers that are connected to each other.

Phishing An attempt to trick people into visiting malicious websites

to steal their personal information.

Privacy Freedom from unauthorized collection and use of your personal

information.

Pop-up A pop-up window on a computer screen that attempts to lead

you to an unwanted website.

Privacy Allow a person to control what information is shared on the

settings internet.

Search Engine Computer software used to search data (such as text or a database)

for specified information.

Social Media Forms of electronic communication (such as websites for social

networking) through which users create online communities to share information, ideas, personal messages, and other content

such as videos and funny memes.

Spam Unwanted e-mail that is sent to large numbers of people and

that consists mostly of advertisements.

Streaming To view something online without downloading it to your

computer or device. An example of streaming is listening

to music on Youtube or watching your favorite shows on Netflix.

Surfing Browsing multiple websites on the internet.

Troll Someone who posts upsetting messages or images on

social media for the sole purpose of gaining attention.

Upload Sending information from your computer to an online storage

device, website, or social media platform.

Virus A program that is able to copy itself to cause harm to your

computer or network.

World Wide A part of the internet that contains websites and webpages.




PERSONAL INFORMATION
